Extension of expiry date for national authorisation – Celcure MC-T3 – NO-2017-0136

We refer to the R4BP 3 communication of 28 February 2022, concerning the expiry date of the authorisation of the biocidal product Celcure MC-T3 containing the active substances basic copper carbonate and tebuconazole. The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby extend the expiry date until 22 March 2024.

Background

In Norway, the expiry date for Celcure MC-T3 is currently 22 March 2022. However, the reference Member State for the re-evaluation, Finland, has notified the relevant Member States, including Norway, on 28 February 2022 that they have extended the authorisation for Celcure MC-T3 until 22 March 2024 because the renewal is still on-going. The extension was made to ensure there will be adequate time also for the mutual recognition process.

As a concerned Member State, the Norwegian Environment Agency follows the decision made by the reference Member State.

Decision

The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby confirms that the expiry date of the authorisation granted for Celcure MC-T3 has been extended until 22 March 2024 in line with the decision of the reference Member State of the re-evaluation.

Apart from the extension of the expiry date outlined above, the authorisation conditions as state in the authorisation letter dated 20 October 2017 are valid.

No fee will be charged regarding the change of the expiry date.

Appeal

The decision can be appealed to the Ministry of Climate and Environment, in accordance with Article 28 of the Public Administration Act. The complaint must be submitted to the Norwegian Environment Agency within 3 weeks after receipt of this letter, in accordance with Article 29 of the Public Administration Act.
