## The priority for evaluating the substance has been reconsidered based on:

	The initial hazard ground of concern has been verified and considered of low priority
	The initial exposure/risk ground of concern has been verified and considered of low priority

	Already ongoing or implemented regulatory process(es)  The Substance was originally included in the Community Action Plan (CoRAP) for Substance Evaluation (SEV) to clarify concerns related to its potential endocrine disrupting (ED) properties for the environment. Since the CoRAP inclusion, generation of information related to the endocrine-disrupting properties of the substance has been required under compliance check.¹ Furthermore, new information is expected from the assessment of the ED properties of salicylic acid (EC 200-712-3) which is a metabolite of the Substance which may inform on the ED assessment for the Substance.  Based on the generated information, the eMSCA currently does not consider pursuing the ED concern for the environment for the Substance under SEV as a priority.
