<p><input checked="" type="checkbox"/> Already ongoing or implemented regulatory process(es)</p> <p>The substance p-(2,3-epoxypropoxy)-N,N-bis(2,3-epoxypropyl)aniline was included on CoRAP due to hazard concerns for</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • suspected M, • suspected sensitizer. <p>The concern for mutagenicity, including potential germ cell mutagenicity, is expected to be clarified via compliance check. The relevance of investigating the end-point of mutagenicity under SEv is therefore now low.</p> <p>With respect to skin sensitisation, the information available in the dossier appears to fulfill the classification criteria under CLP for classification as Skin Sens 1A, as notified by the registrant, thus permitting directly risk management (harmonised classification) and rendering a substance evaluation superfluous.</p> <p>In case the above mentioned concerns will not be (sufficiently) addressed by the above mentioned actions, the substance may be re-introduced in CoRAP again at a later stage.</p>
