Approval of a minor change to biocidal product authorisation - Creosote BPF Koppers -NO-2017-0128

We refer to your application for a change to the biocidal product authorisation for Creosote BPF Koppers - NO-2017-0128, R4BP 3 Case no BC-MB049626-43.

According to Article 50 (2) in Regulation (EU) No 528/2012 concerning the making available on the market and use of biocidal products, changes to the conditions laid down in a biocidal product authorisation shall be approved by the Competent Authority. Changes to a product authorisation are further described in Regulation (EU) No 354/2013.

Regulation (EU) No 528/2012 and Regulation (EU) No 354/2013 are implemented in Norwegian law through the Norwegian Biocide Regulation of 18 April 2017 No. 480.

The change to Creosote BPF Koppers concerns a change in the instructions for use, where the treatment of agricultural fence poles for export only is included in the authorised uses. This change is covered by the existing risk assessment in the PAR and is classified as a minor change, in accordance with the criteria laid down in Title 2 of the Annex to Regulation (EU) No. 354/2013.

Decision

Subject to Articles 19 and 50 of the BPR, cf. § 1 of the Norwegian Biocide Regulation, the Norwegian Environment Agency approves the proposed change to Creosote BPF Koppers.

No other changes than the above mentioned is accepted with this letter. Apart from the change outlined above, the authorisation conditions as stated in the authorisation letter dated 30.03.2017 are valid.

The revised Summary of Product Characteristics (SPC) is uploaded to R4BP3.

An electronic copy of the revised label/TDS/SDS with the Norwegian authorisation number NO-2017-0128 shall be submitted to the Norwegian Environment Agency within three months from the date of this letter, using the email address biocides@miljodir.no.

Appeal

This decision can be appealed to the Ministry of Climate and Environment, in accordance with Article 28 of the Public Administration Act. The complaint must be submitted to the Norwegian Environment Agency within 3 weeks after receipt of this letter, in accordance with Article 29 of the Public Administration Act.
